Security Cameras Scotty's South Park:

The clerk stated the current security cameras at the south park are not functioning. The park has experienced a recent case of vandalism at the fair building and cars' spinning out on the ball fields a better system is needed. The system installed at the burn pit and at city hall work well and have night vision where the old system does not. A bid from Perfection Data Solutions was obtained for the new cameras of \$7,465 and an electrical bid of \$5,510. Council discussed looking for a second electrical bid.

Cable One/Fiber Optics / Zoom Services:

The clerk noted the video and recording system has been installed, given the delay experienced at the beginning of the meeting, and two items are needed to complete the process: A faster internet connection and a Zoom service. Direct Communication has presented a proposal at \$169 per month. Cable One coaxial is a second option but they have not presented a proposal. And the last component would be the purchase of a zoom subscription service. Council discussed proceeding and obtaining a price from Cable One with an activation date for December.

Review/Approval of Eagle Rock Sanitation Contract:

The chair asked the attorney if the city should proceed with the contract with Eagle Rock given PSI letter of protest. The attorney stated it would be best if the city held off on entering into the contract until he's had an opportunity to review PSI letter.

Declare Surplus Property:

Mitch Bradley stated that after last week's approval for a new mule that the current mule is deemed surplus and needs council declaration of same with him being authorized to sale it auction.

Purchase of County Grader:

Mitch Bradley stated the county intends to sale at auction the road grader that the city has been looking at. However, county's legal said a transfer/exchange between the city and county is not in the county's best interest and denied the city's application to purchase. Mr. Bradley stated that being said, he would like to be authorized to purchase the grader at the auction. Mr. Bradley has discussed the grader with the county's mechanics and both of them indicated the county has not had any issue with the grader. He would like approval to purchase the grader at \$35,000.

Councilman Burke stated Mitch should discuss the item at the next commissioners meeting and if that fails to be productive to authorize him to purchase the grader at auction not to exceed \$37,500. Motion seconded by Councilwoman King.

LID #10: 4th North, Tall Ave, and 3rd West:

Marvin Fielding from Keller's Assoc. came forward and present the council with three proposed improvements for 4th North, Tall Ave and 3rd West. On 4th North the total cost of the improvements total \$998,000 with the homeowners paying \$202,596 for sidewalks and 9 feet of asphalt. The cost of the Tall Ave improvements total \$561,000 of which the homeowners share is \$56,448 with the homeowners paying for sidewalks, 4 feet of asphalt. There are three property on 3rd West that do not have sidewalks or curb/gutters. The property owners would pay \$15,850 for sidewalks and 10 feet of asphalt. Mr. Fielding indicated that most of the property owners have been contact regarding the improvements with an estimate of their share being presented to them.

Council discussed the pro and cons of having the homeowner's pickup the improvements given the current economic conditions.

Councilwoman Weight moved that the city initiate a resolution of the city's intention to create LID #10 for the three areas noted seconded by Councilwoman King.

The chair called for a voice poll: All in favor none opposed.

Councilman Burke noted his street underwent the same upgrade 2 years ago and overall it has been a betterment in the area. He noted that Clairmore paid for curb and gutters and why isn't the current proposal having the homeowners follow suit. Councilman Datwyler also had reservations with other homeowners paying for the curb/gutter and in this case having the city residents bear the associated costs. Councilwoman Harrison noted the costs of the curb/gutter will add almost 50% more to the homeowners. Councilwoman Weight also commented the property owners should pay for their curb/gutter.

Councilwoman King moved that the cost estimates be changed to include the curb/gutter to the property owners seconded by Councilwoman Weight.
