

City of Rigby
Council Meeting Minutes
October 18, 2018

Mayor Richardson called the meeting to order at 7:00pm Thursday, Oct. 18, 2018. The pledge of allegiance was given by Adam Hall and the prayer given by Douglas Burke.

The mayor asked the clerk to call the roll:

Acceptance of Airport Grant and Resolution #190-2019:

The mayor explained the airport board had applied for an airport grant to assist with the purchase of the land south of the airport and the state Division of Aeronautics have available \$47,000 to assist with the purchase. The council needs to approve the grant via the resolution #190-2019. The mayor reads the resolution.

Councilman Hall moved to approve the grant and adopt resolution #190-2019. Motion seconded by Councilman Burke.

Approval of Minutes:

Councilman Datwyler/Hall mentioned the vote recorded on the acceptance of the museum lease had Councilman Hall voting nay and it should reflect his vote as aye.

Councilman Taylor moved to approve the minutes as corrected seconded by Councilman Hall.

The mayor called for a voice poll: all in favor with Councilman Burke abstaining.

Review and Approval of Minutes:

Councilman Datwyler moved to approve the bills seconded by Councilman Olsen.

Other Council Business:

Mayor - Annis Highway: The mayor mentioned that after last council he notice homemade speed signs being placed along the street. Although the signs are appreciated they should not be covering the city signs.

K Crank Hearing: the mayor reviewed the facts surrounding the hearing concerning the Kee Crank property which had received a no recommend from the planning/zoning to approve a change of zone from R-1 to R-2. The Cranks had filed suit in district court and the judge ruled that a new hearing was to be held cancelling the prior decisions by the council. The new hearing is set for November 1, 2018.

Main Street Parking: Councilman Olsen had heard from a citizen if parking could be allowed in the center of Main Street to alleviate and make more parking available. Public Works Director Bradley indicated Main Street is controlled by the state and any change such as that would need to begin with the state.

Winter Breakfast: Councilman Taylor asked about venues to hold the Christmas Breakfast. Senior Citizen Center was mentioned and if the center would allow it to be catered. Need to check with the center.

Trash along Streets: Councilman Hall voiced his concern with sofas and tv entertainment units were being left along the street on 2nd West. He wondered what could be done to clean them up. Public Works Director Bradley indicated he was opposed to begin cleaning stuff up in that it would lead to the city having to haul off more items. Recommended contacting the property owners and having them do the cleanup.

Sidewalk Program: Councilman Hall asked how much was in the sidewalk program as he would like to have the city installing sidewalks. The mayor said he was reluctant to enforce the sidewalk code until the city can have all of its sidewalks installed. Public Works Director Bradley stated the fund has been depleted in prior years and \$500 has been expended already from this year's budget.

Public Comment:

Mike Crank: Mr. Crank corrected the mayor's statement in that the planning/zoning commission recommendation of "to accept the zone change." He also stated they did not want to sue the city but due to errors in the reconsideration hearing the facts and decision of the first hearing was not made within the stated time as specified by state code (14 days) that they sought relief from the district court. They feel the 6 acres is suitable to R-2 zoning and would complement the area.

Adjournment:

Councilman Hall moved to adjourn seconded by Councilman Burke.


The mayor called for a voice poll: All in favor none opposed.
