DON'T THINK, "IT'S NOT MY CHILD." Every parent should assume their child is as susceptible as any other child. Even good kids know kids who are drinking or abusing drugs. And that opens the door for opportunities.

- Typically a youth has been abusing drugs for at least one year before parents acknowledge a problem.
- Teenagers whose parents talk to them regularly about the dangers of alcohol & drugs are 42% less likely to use alcohol & drugs than those whose parents don't talk to them.

A presentation by teens discussing the problems with the legalization of marijuana for medical use in Idaho.

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Idaho is bracing for a battle to legalize medical marijuana, as a growing number of U.S. states permit pot for both health and recreational use.

The Idaho Senate has made its position clear with a 29-5 vote against allowing marijuana even for medical uses in this state. The resolution, which will now go to the state House of Representatives, is only a political gesture. Marijuana is already illegal under both state and federal law.

Proponents of liberalized pot laws spearheaded by a group called Compassionate Idaho told senators they were working on a medical marijuana initiative they hope to place on the state ballot next year.
